- 2. Sustainable Agriculture
 - a. Urban Farming
 - i. Urban Agriculture Committee May 11th meeting, next meeting July 13th. Urban Ag committee visited Atlanta where urban Ag is established and growing with its increasing population. Making future trips to Detroit, Chicago, & California to get information on these established city codes and programs. Project modeled after the freedom farm collective, an extension of freedom school program at MLK park. Collaboration of city-wide producers.  - ii. USDA Urban Agriculture Program there will be a citizen committee, big bump in funding, a lot of opportunity with west Michigan. Carlos met with Debbie Stabenow (D-MI). Funding is going to USDA FSA and Urban County committees (elected).
 - iii. Plainsong Farm providing food for 3 entities and utilizing funding.

b. RCPP Project Updates

- i. EQIP sign ups 12 sign ups, 4 submitted. Remaining funding allocation to be determined. Joel Betts, new MAEP Tech, identifies sites so LGROW can potentially install a monitor.
- ii. Ottawa county ground water quantity and quality, includes Ottawa/Allegan/Kent/Muskegon where watershed joins together. May 2021 grant received. Cultivating Resilience field day on August 18th. Practices like cover crops, grassed waterways, grazing management, etc. Protect and preserve the areas where there is still a significant amount of groundwater recharge. Can update existing irrigation but not install new ones. Limited to EQIP design but also has Easements. Ottawa Co. (Becky) is managing easements.

3. Sustainable Watershed Funding Initiative

a. Statewide MOU – Finance sustainability for planning, implementation, and operation.
Legislation needed to get money distributed through a regional planning body. Strong public survey results taken pre covid/inflation. A lot to be determined before future
